



MetroMorphosis, a local non-profit, is seeking submissions for its second annual **Black Futures Kuumba Contest!**

Black Futures is a month-long celebration of the rich history, contributions, and culture of the African Diaspora. Guided by the Ghanaian principle of [Sankofa](#), Black Futures Month learns from the past to build a thriving future.

This year's theme is *What We Carry Forward: Small Acts That Shaped Our World.*

Kuumba (pronounced koo-OOM-bah) is the Swahili word for creativity and the sixth principle of Kwanzaa, emphasizing the responsibility to use our talents to make our communities stronger and more beautiful than we inherited them. Through this contest, young people are invited to creatively reflect on the small actions, decisions, and practices—past or present—that helped shape the world they live in today.

CALL FOR SUBMISSIONS

We invite youth artists, writers, performers, and creatives to submit an original work inspired by *What We Carry Forward: Small Acts That Shaped Our World.* Submissions should highlight how everyday actions—like teaching, caring, creating, or organizing—have shaped families, communities, or cultures across the Black Diaspora. Entries may draw from history, lived experience, or personal perspective.

WHO: Any creative **age 12-18**, regardless of school enrollment status

WHAT: **Digital Art (2D or 3D), Written, and Performance pieces** that creatively interpret the theme *What We Carry Forward: Small Acts That Shaped Our World.* Works will be judged by a committee based on creativity, clarity, craftsmanship, and alignment with the theme.

WHEN: The Creatives Contest **opens January 27, 2025. All entries must be received by 11 pm on February 19, 2025.** Finalists will be notified via email by February 24, 2025. Grand prize winners will be announced on February 26, 2025.

HOW: Submit **one original piece in one of the categories** below by visiting metromorphosis.net/blackfutures

Submissions in multiple categories are allowed, provided guidelines are met. All submissions must adhere to the contest and category guidelines. **All finalists will be invited to the Black Futures Reception**, where the winners will be announced. **One winner will be selected in each category by a committee** of professional artists, writers, and creatives and will be awarded the grand prize at the Reception.

WHY: **All finalists will be invited to attend a Reception with local creatives, investors, and community members.** Grand Prize winners will receive:

- Cash and Prizes (up to \$500)
- Visibility and Exposure through various outlets for the remainder of the year.



GUIDELINES AND REQUIREMENTS

Submissions will be accepted until 11 pm CST on February 19, 2025, in the following categories:

- **Digital Art:** any 2D or 3D image created using computers, software, or other electronic devices. Original inventions can be submitted in this category provided they are showcased entirely through digital means. The use of AI is strictly prohibited in this category.
- **Writing:** any essay, poem, or fiction that is created by hand or with a word processor and does not contain images or sound. Voice to Text is permitted for creation purposes but must not be submitted as the final product. The use of AI is not permitted.
- **Performance:** any submission that combines words, images, sound, and physical movement. This includes spoken word pieces, dramatic readings, and any renderings that require physical touch to display. The use of AI is not permitted. Original inventions can be submitted here if they require an actual person to showcase them.

Submissions must adhere to the following guidelines to be accepted. Any submission that is in violation of these guidelines will be automatically disqualified. This is at the sole discretion of the selection committee.

General Guidelines:

- Only one submission per category, per person, will be accepted. For example, you may submit a digital art piece and a written piece, but you cannot submit an essay and a fiction piece.
- All submissions must be submitted through digital means and include a completed submission form.
- Submissions should be original and not previously published. Previously submitted work is accepted provided it has not been published, copyrighted, or promised to any other outlet.
- The use of AI is not permitted.
- Submissions should avoid the use of overly violent or explicit content. "Overly violent and explicit" will be at the sole discretion of the selection committee.

Digital Art Guidelines

- Submission must be an original 2D or 3D image created through digital means (computers, software, or other electronic devices) and submitted as a .png, .jpg, jpeg, or vector file.
- Submission must be a high-resolution file (minimum of 300 PPI and not exceeding 10MB)
- Submission must include an artist statement that explains the merit of the piece.

Writing Guidelines

- Submission must be an original piece of writing created by hand or using a word processor containing no images or sound.
- Submissions must be fewer than 2500 words, typed and submitted as .doc, .docx, or .pdf.
- Submissions may be creative or technical, fiction or nonfiction, poetry or prose



Performance Guidelines

- Submissions must be original pieces no longer than 10 minutes, including any introductions or credits.
- Submissions must be recorded. Live submissions will not be accepted.
- Submissions in this category must be submitted in one of the following formats: .mp4, pdf, .mov, or .avi

Prizes

All finalists will be notified by email and invited to the Black Futures Reception on Thursday, February 26th at 6pm. One winner in each category will be selected by a committee of artists, writers, and creatives and will be awarded the **Grand Prize**:

- Cash and Prizes (up to \$500)
- Visibility and Exposure through various outlets for the remainder of the year.
